Affordable Care Act aka ObamaCare Updates

We stated in our year-end December Benefit Briefs!, despite all the problems that ObamaCare had last year with the roll out of its healthcare.gov website; delays for employers with 50 to 99 employees; complex regulations; etc. our reading of the "tea leaves" is that President Obama will not be issuing any further delays to the implementation of the law as well as the "pay or play" penalties. We are continuing with this position, even though there were 800,000+ reasons that surfaced on February 19th.

- Before the latest news came down 3 days ago, taxpayers were already in for a rude awakening when they prepared their taxes for 2014 and it will get worse in 2015 and 2016. The Dallas Morning News carried a great article that was written by Pamela Yip that explained the complexity of taxes and ObamaCare.
- The New York Times wrote a <u>comprehensive</u> <u>article</u> regarding the 800,000+ taxpayers who were issued wrong tax forms by Health & Human Services (HHS) which prevents them from filing their tax return now and were urged to hold off from filing their return until the new forms are reissued in 4-5 week. Essentially, they were given wrong numbers to calculate their subsidy and either repay the excess or will be entitled to an additional subsidy. This discovery also prompted fallout regarding the following issues:

- Those taxpayers who have already filed their return for 2014 (estimates at 50,000 taxpayers) <u>will now have to file amended</u> <u>returns</u>.
- The Administration has extended the deadline from February 15 to April 30 so that people can enroll this year and not have to pay the penalty in 2016. It seems hard to believe, but according to certain news sources, supposedly 40 to 50% of taxpayers eligible for subsidies are not aware that they are eligible. Since the individual "pay or play" penalty goes up for 2015 and 2016, they are trying to minimize the negative impact. Of course, there are already 30 types of exemptions that individuals can qualify for not having insurance and not having to pay the penalty.
- Of course, when people applied for the subsidies during the enrollment in early 2014 and 2015, they are using "income estimates" and then it is true that they file their actual tax return. Obviously, some people could have low balled the estimated income number and thereby increase the projected subsidy and now the chickens are coming home to roost. Others may have overestimated projected income, and are now eligible for a larger subsidy than they originally calculated and now would get that back on their tax return.
- It is not only the federal exchange (healthcare.gov), but we also recently learned that some state exchanges also sent out incorrect forms. For example, California sent out over 100,000 wrong numbers as well.
- On a related note, Kaiser Health News carried an interesting Q&A regarding the repayment of premium tax credits if the Marketplace (healthcare.gov) miscalculated them. If you know someone who is eligible for subsidies, <u>pass this</u> <u>article</u> on to them.
